Following on from my last newsletter I am pleased to advise that Gemma was commissioned as our Community Development Worker on Pentecost Sunday, quite

an appropriate day taking into account the message of Pentecost and reflecting on the words spoken by Jesus in promising that the holy spirit would come to equip his disciples for the ministry to which he was sending them. This post grew organically through the ministry of the Food Initiative Group which started Christmas 2020. What began with us supporting families over the Christmas holiday period with food has now grown into a much wider ministry in the life of our primary schools and community. The gift of the
