Even with such huge numbers of hampers being delivered, this operation ran more smoothly than ever thanks to everyone's hard work. Thank you also to all who contributed to the Lent 'sponsor a bag' appeal. This support is vital to our food hamper project as it continues to grow, so we really do appreciate every contribution made. A total amount of £932.50 was raised which included a donation of £250 from Andersons Funeral Directors — thank you to all who supported this project.

Then we welcomed lots of families into church for our 'Xplore' family fun day. This was packed with excitement as we looked at the relationship between faith and science. Who knew 'Jesus Christ Slime Star' would be such a popular activity!! However, by exploring things in such a fun way, our families felt welcomed, had a great time, and we were able to plant seeds whilst they were here with us. Our Easter programme also gave us plenty of opportunities to reach out to our community, with working together with other churches, singing in the Port Arcades, the walk of witness, our knitted chicks going out in to the community.
